

Ticket To Work: Picking An Employment Network

Ticket to Work (Ticket) is a free program from Social Security. You can use the Ticket if you get Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI). The Ticket helps you find and keep a job.

How do I use the Ticket program?

To use the Ticket, you need to pick an Employment Network (EN). ENs are private groups that work with Social Security. They help you make a plan to get a job. To find an EN:

What EN is right for me?

You can talk to more than one EN before you pick one. Ask questions to help you decide.

- **What services do you have?** ENs can give different help. Ask if they have helped other people with your disability.
- **Who will work with me? Do they know how?** Ask the EN who will work with you. Ask what training or education they have.
- **How many people with disabilities have you helped?** Ask the EN how many of their clients found jobs.

What if I have a problem with my EN?

If you're not happy with your EN, you can:

- File a complaint with Social Security.
- Pick a different EN to work with.
- Get help from the PABSS program at DRRI.
