

Housing Accommodations

People with disabilities can ask for changes that help them use and enjoy their home. These changes are called **reasonable accommodations**.

Examples may include:

- Keeping an emotional support animal
- Moving to another apartment
- Getting an accessible parking space

How to Ask for a Reasonable Accommodation

It is best to ask in writing. Keep a copy for your records.

Tell the landlord what you need and how it helps with your disability.

Your landlord may ask for a letter from a doctor, therapist, counselor, or other licensed provider.

If Your Request Is Denied

Ask for the reason in writing.
